

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE "MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS, CONVERNING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES".

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois, as follows:

1. That this amendment to the above-mentioned ordinance shall in no way revoke or affect any of the ordinances relative to Chapter 3 and Chapter 3A other than those which it displaces.

2. That henceforth applications shall be directed to and filed with the local liquor control commission and shall be accompanied by the deposit of a certified or cashier's check, postal money order or cash in the full amount of the annual license fee required to be paid for the kind of license applied for. If any such application is denied, the deposit required shall be returned to applicant by the local commission.

3. That any and all applications for liquor licenses shall be filed with the local liquor control commission relative to above and also accompanied by the required bond relative thereto on or before twenty (20) days prior to the second monthly meeting in the month of June of the given year for the license application.

4. That the necessary bond, accompanied by the above-mentioned application, shall be in full force and effect for the entire one year period covered by the license application.

5. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage as provided by law.

Article 3. Limitation on construction of sewers or sewerage structures.

No sewer or sewerage structure may be constructed within a 150 foot radius of any existing or proposed well to be used for public water supply, unless such construction meet the minimum requirement of the Illinois Department of Health. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate this article shall be fined not less than Five Dollars nor more than Twenty Five Dollars for each day in which any violation of such article is done.

ORDINANCE NO. 69-7

MUNICIPAL SERVICE OCCUPATION TAX

BE IT ORDAINED by the Village President and Board of Trustees of Billage of East Dundee that:

Section 1. A tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in this municipality in the business of making sales of service at the rate of one per-cent of the cost price of all tangible personal property transferred by said servicemen either in the form of tangible personal property or in the form of real estate as an incident to a sale of service, in accordance with the provisions of Section 8-11-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

Section 2. Every supplier or serviceman required to account for Municipal Service Occupation Tax for the benefit of this municipality shall file, on or before the last day of each calendar month, the report to the State Department of Revenue required by Section Nine of the "Service Occupation Tax Act" approved July 10, 1961, as amended.

Section 3. At the time such report is filed, there shall be paid to the State Department of Revenue the amount of tax hereby imposed.

Section 4. The village clerk is hereby directed to transmit to the State Department of Revenue a certified copy of this Ordinance not later than five (5) days after the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be published within ten (10) days of its enactment as provided in Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code and shall be effective from and after the first day of October, 1969.

Section 6. Ordinance No.23a entitled Municipal Service Occupation Tax sections one through five inclusive passed April 21, 1967 is hereby repealed effective October 1, 1969.

ORDINANCE NO. 69-8

MUNICIPAL RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee that:

Section 1. A tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in the business of selling tangible personal property at retail in this Village at the rate of one per-cent of the gross receipts from such sales made in the course of such business while this ordinance is in effect, in accordance with the provisions of Section 8-11-1 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

Section 2. Every such person engaged in such business in the Village shall file on or before the last day of each calendar month, the report to the State Department of Revenue required by Section Three of "An Act in Relation to a tax upon Persons Engaged in the Business of Selling Tangible Personal Property to Purchasers for Use or Consumption" approved June 28, 1933, as amended.

Section 3. At the time such report is filed, there shall be paid to the State Department of Revenue the amount of tax hereby imposed on account of the receipts from sales of tangible personal property during the preceding month.

Section 4. The Village clerk is hereby directed to transmit to the State Department of Revenue a certified copy of this Ordinance not later than five (5) days after the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be published within ten (10) days of its enactment as provided in Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code and shall be effective from and after the first day of October, 1969.

Section 6. Ordinance No. Chapter 23a entitled Municipal Retailers' Occupation Tax Sections one through five inclusive passed July 17, 1967 is hereby repealed effective October 1, 1969.

ORDINANCE NO. 69 - 9

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO VUE-SONICS, INC., A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS, AND ASSIGNS, A FRANCHISE TO ERECT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION FACILITIES IN, UNDER, OVER, ALONG, ACROSS AND UPON THE STREETS, LANES AVENUES, EASEMENTS, ALLEYS, BRIDGES, HIGHWAYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION BY CABLE OR TELEVISION, RADIO AND MUSIC IMPULSES FOR SALE TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAID VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, Illinois, OR OTHER PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: Grant of Authority. In consideration of the faithful performance and observance of the conditions and reservations hereinafter specified, a franchise is hereby granted to VUE-SONICS, INC., a Corporation, its successors and assigns (hereinafter referred to as the "Company", to erect, maintain and operate television, radio and music transmission and distribution facilities, and additions thereto, in, under, over, along, across and upon the streets, lanes, avenues, easements, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and other places in the Village of East Dundee, (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality"), and subsequent additions thereto, for the purpose of transmission and distribution of television, radio and music impulses in accordance with the laws and regulations of the United States of America and the State of Illinois and the ordinances and regulations of the Municipality for a period of twenty-five years from and after the effective date of this Ordinance, with an option to renew for a similar period.

SECTION 2: Construction. (a) The Company's transmission and distribution system poles, wires and appurtenances shall be located, erected and maintained so as not to endanger or interfere with the lives of persons or to interfere with any improvements the Municipality may deem proper to make or to hinder unnecessarily or to obstruct the free use of the streets, alleys, bridges or other public property and shall not interfere with the transmission or distribution system of any public utility located on any such street, alley, bridge or other public property.

Section 2. (b) The erection of any poles to accomplish the distribution system in the Municipality shall be first approved in writing by the Building inspector of the Municipality. All plans for construction in the Municipality shall be submitted in duplicate to the Municipality showing the location of all poles, lines and facilities. These plans shall be kept up to date, and the complete set therefor shall be retained in the office of the Clerk of the Municipality. The location and erection of all structures in the Municipality shall be under the supervision of the Building Inspector of the Municipality.

Section 2. (c) In the maintenance and operation of the transmission and distribution system in the streets, alleys and other

SECTION 9: Removal of Property. In the event the Company fails in the performance of the terms and conditions contained in this Ordinance and the Municipality lawfully revokes this Ordinance, the Company shall remove all of its plants, structures, works, pipes, mains, conduits, cables, poles and wires and refill at its own expense any excavation that be made by it and shall leave said streets, alleys, public ways and places in as good condition as that prevailing prior to the Company's removal of the equipment and appliances.

SECTION 10: Use of Existing Poles. The Company shall use as much as possible existing poles within the Municipality limits. It is the stated intention of the Municipality that all other holders of public license and franchises within the corporate limits of the Municipality shall cooperate with the Company to allow the Company joint usage of their poles and pole line facilities wherever possible and wherever such usage does not interfere with the normal operation of said poles and pole lines so that the number of new or additional poles constructed by the Company within the Municipality may be minimized. Such cooperation shall include the right of joint usage at reasonable rates and on reasonable terms.

SECTION 11: Company Not to Compete. This franchise shall not in any way be construed as a license or permit to the Company to engage in the sales, repair or service of radio or television sets or equipment. As part of the consideration for the granting of this franchise, the Company has agreed not to so engage.

SECTION 12: Free Service for Municipalities, Schools and Libraries. In order to best service the community, the Company agrees to provide without charge one connection to the Municipality, to each school, public or parochia, and to each public library, and to provide service to these connections without charge. The Company further agrees to make available to all municipalities and school districts in which subscribers are located, a channel for the purpose of adult education classes, supplemental education, school announcements, reports by Municipality officials, live or delayed coverage of Municipality sessions, public information, public announcements and emergency warnings.

SECTION 13: Compliance with Regulations. The Company agrees to comply with all local and state regulations and all regulations of the Federal Communications Commission.

SECTION 14: Franchise Fee. The Company agrees to pay annually to the Municipality 5.0% of all gross revenue from monthly service charges, and to afford the authorized officials or representatives of the municipality access to any and all company records at all reasonable times for the purpose of determining whether said fee has been properly calculated and paid.

SECTION 15: The Company shall not sell, transfer, exchange or assign its franchise herein granted, without the prior approval of the corporate authorities of the Municipality.

SECTION 16: The Company agrees that it will cooperate with the Municipality and any person granted permission by the Municipality in regard to the moving of houses, and that it will move its wires,

PETITION FOR DISCONNECTION OF TERRITORY  
FROM THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the following described territory (herein called "Territory") situated in the County of Kane, State of Illinois, heretofore has been annexed to and is now a part of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois, a municipal corporation:

Parcel One: Estates 1, 2, 19 and 20 in Block 6 of Sec. No. Two, First Addition to Lakewood Lodge Estates, being a subdivision of part of the Southeast quarter of Section 14, and of the Northeast quarter of Section 23, Township 42 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meridian, in the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois.

Parcel Two: That part of the Southeast quarter of Section 14, Township 42 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows: Beginning at the Southeast corner of the West half of the Southeast quarter of said Southeast quarter; thence North along the East line of the West half of said quarter to the Northerly line extended Easterly of Ravine Road as established in Sec. No. Two First Addition to Lakewood Lodge Estates; thence West along said extended Northerly line of Ravine Road to the Easterly line of Valley View Road as established in said Sec. No. Two, First Addition to Lakewood Lodge Estates; thence Southwesterly along the Easterly line of said Valley View Road to the South line of said Southeast quarter; thence East along said South line 606.99 feet to the point of beginning, in the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois;

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned, being the owners of record of the above described land within the Territory, there being no electors residing thereon, hereby petition the corporate authorities of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois to consent by ordinance that the Territory be disconnected from the Village of East Dundee and annexed to the Village of Carpentersville, Illinois in accordance with the provisions of Section 7-1-24 of Chapter 24 of the Illinois Revised Statutes.
