

ORDINANCE NUMBER 06 - 12

ORDINANCE AMENDING ANNUAL FEE SCHEDULE
FOR THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE

WHEREAS, the Village of East Dundee is a home rule unit of local government under and pursuant to Section 6 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, has the authority to exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including but not limited to the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee having determined that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of East Dundee that the Annual Fee Schedule be amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, COOK AND KANE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. That the Annual Fee Schedule of the Village of East Dundee is hereby amended, effective May 1, 2006, by increasing the Water User Charge (Sec. 51.37(A)) for Residential and Commercial Rates to \$3.89 per 1,000 Gallons.

Section Two. That the Annual Fee Schedule of the Village of East Dundee is hereby amended, effective March 1, 2007, by increasing the Water User Charge (Sec. 51.37(A)) for Residential and Commercial Rates to \$4.49 per 1,000 Gallons.

Section Three. That the Annual Fee Schedule of the Village of East Dundee is hereby amended, effective May 1, 2006, by increasing the Wastewater User Charge (Sec. 53.62(a)) for Residential and Commercial Rates to \$3.20 per 1,000 Gallons.

Section Four. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.

Section Five. Repeal. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or parts thereof in conflict herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
