

ORDINANCE No. 79-1

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 75-7, Chapter 3, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois;

SEC. 1 That Ordinance 75-7, Section 6, Paragraph 15 of Chapter 3, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

(15) To keep open for business or to admit the public or patrons or customers of persons to any premises licensed under this Ordinance for the retail sale of alcoholic liquors during the hours within which sale of such liquor is prohibited or to permit or allow persons, patrons or customers to remain in or about the licenses premises either before or after hours designated within which the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors is prohibited on the licensed premises; provided, however, that restaurants, clubs, drug stores, grocery stores, hotels and motels may keep their places of business open subject only to the provisions that no sale at retail of alcoholic liquors or the consumption by patrons or customers or by the public of alcoholic liquors shall be permitted or allowed on said licensed premises during the hours prohibited;

SEC. 2 That this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval, and proper publication.

ORDINANCE 79-2

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 28 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS, CONCERNING WATER AND SEWER SERVICE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees for the Village of East Dundee, that:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 28, Article 2, of the municipal code is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein, the following Section 34 (A) thereof, following to be known as SECTION 34 (A):

SECTION 34(A) USE OF WELL DISCONTINUANCE. Within two (2) years after the adoption of this ordinance, the Owner of any Well within the Village (or within one (1) mile from the Village limits) shall cease using the Well as a source of water and shall make connection with the waterworks system of the Village of East Dundee, provided said system is within three hundred (300) feet of the nearest property line of the property on which the well is located. Upon completion of the connection to the waterworks system, the owner of the well shall close up the well so that it cannot be used as a source for water and will not be a danger to the public or be an attractive nuisance. Prior to the time limit stated, the Village shall notify the owner of any of the requirements of this Section, but failure to notify shall not relieve the owner of the obligation to comply with this Section.

SECTION TWO: Chapter 28, Article 3, of the municipal code is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein, the following Section 9(A) thereof, following to be known as SECTION 9 (A):

SECTION 9(A) PRIVATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS, DISCONTINUANCE. Within two (2) years after the adoption of this ordinance, the owner of any property generating sewage which is discharged into a private disposal system within the Village (or within one (1) mile of the Village limits) shall make connection with and discharge all sewage into the sewage system of the Village of East Dundee, provided said system is within three hundred (300) feet of the nearest property line of the property on which the private discharge system is located. Upon completion of

said connection to the sewage system, the owner shall cease using the private sewage disposal system, and clean out the system and refill it in a sanitary manner approved by the Village. Prior to the time limit stated, the Village shall notify the owner of any of the requirements of this Section, but failure to so notify, shall not relieve the owner of the obligation to comply with this Section.

SECTION THREE: PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating or failing to comply with any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

ORDINANCE NO. 79-3

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL
ELECTION IN AND FOR THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE
OF EAST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

There shall be a regular election of officers of the Village of East
Dundee, Kane County, Illinois on the 17th day of April, 1979.

SECTION 2:

At such election there shall be elected three (3) Trustees, each of
which officers is to serve a four-year term. The ballot to be used
in such election shall be in the form prescribed by statute; and it
shall be the duty of the Village Clerk to assure the preparation of
a sufficient number of ballots for the election, to cause a sample
of such ballot to be published prior to the day of the election in
the Free Press Newspaper, or some other newspaper published in, or
of general circulation within the Village, and to provide the neces-
sary election supplies for each voting district or precinct.

SECTION 3:

The Village Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of said election
to be given by publishing notice thereof once in the Free Press News-
paper, being a newspaper published in and having a general circulation
within the Village, or some other newspaper published in, or of general
circulation within the Village. The date of such publication shall be
not more than 30 days nor less than 15 days prior to the date set for
said election and said notice shall be published in substantially the
following form:

NOTICE OF ELECTION

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a regular municipal election will
be held in and for the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois,
on Tuesday, the 17th day of April 1979, for the purpose of electing the
following officers of such Village: three Trustees, each of whom is to
serve a term of four years, all as provided by law. For the purpose of
said election, the polling place designated for the entire Village is as
follows:

The polls at said election will be opened at 6:00 o'clock A.M. and will

ORDINANCE 79- 4

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY
TO THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, a verified petition, signed by the legal owners of record of all land within the territory hereinafter described, has been filed with the Village Clerk of the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois, requesting that said territory be annexed to the Village of East Dundee; and,

WHEREAS, JOSEPH GIANQUINTO AND MARIAN GIANQUINTO are the sole owners and are the only electors to reside on said property; and

WHEREAS, the said territory is not within the corporate limits of any municipality but is contiguous to the Village of East Dundee; and,

WHEREAS, all Petitions, documents and other necessary legal requirements are in full compliance with the statutes of the State of Illinois, specifically, Chapter 24, para.7-1-8, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1971; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois that said territory be annexed thereto,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: THAT the following described property:
The South 115 feet of the West 230 feet of the

East 240 feet of Lot 18 of Bonnie Dundee Terrace, the East line of the premises herein described is the West line of State Highway 25 as established by dedication dated July 21, 1928 and recorded September 20, 1928, in book 879, page 363 as document 313231, in the Township of Dundee, Kane County, Illinois, together with any and all areas extending to the far side of any adjacent street and highway.

being indicated on an accurate map of the annexed territory, (which is appended to and made a part of this Ordinance) is hereby annexed to the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois.

SECTION 2: THAT the Village Clerk is hereby directed to record with the Recorder of Deeds and to file with the County Clerk a certified copy of this Ordinance, together with the accurate map of the territory annexed appended to said Ordinance.

SECTION 3: THAT this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

ORDINANCE 79-5

BEING AN ORDINANCE VACATING A SECTION OF ROBERT AVENUE,
NORTH OF ROUTE 72, IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, KANE
COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of East Dundee has received
a request from the Board of Directors of Summit School for
the vacation of a portion of a street hereinafter described,
abutting the property of said Summit School; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Revised Statutes,
Chapter 24, Section 11-91-1, the Village has caused a Fifteen
(15) day notice of the hearing on said vacation to be placed
in a newspaper of general circulation within the area of the
Village of East Dundee; and

WHEREAS, at the hearing on May 21, 1979, at 7:30 p.m.,
all interested persons were allowed to be heard concerning the
proposal for vacation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees deemed it is in the
best interest of the Village of East Dundee that a certain
portion of Robert Avenue, hereinafter described, be vacated.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and
the Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee; that

SECTION ONE: That a portion of the street
known as Robert Avenue, legally described as follows:

That part of Robert Avenue lying South of the North
line of Lot 8 and the North right-of-way line of
Illinois Route #72 and extended Easterly 60.0 feet
to the West line of Lot 11 in Block 1 of Fox River
Bluffs, Unit #1, a Subdivision of part of Sections
23 and 26, lying North of Higgens Road, in Township
42 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meri-
dian, in the Village of East Dundee, Kane County,
Illinois (approximate dimensions-- 60' x 150')

be and the same is hereby vacated.

Provided, that the Village retains the right to
maintain, operate, repair and replace, by itself or
by any licensee or a holder of a franchise from the
Village, any poles, wires, pipes, conduits, sewer
mains, water mains, or any other facility or equip-
ment for the maintenance or operation of any utility
now located in the street or portion thereof vacated
by this ordinance.

Provided, that the Village of East Dundee shall
receive full fair market value of the property in
question if Summit School sells, transfers or assigns
its interest in said property; said value shall be

determined at the time of sale, transfer or assign
as provided.

SECTION TWO: Said ordinance shall be duly
recorded with Recorder of Deeds, Kane County, Illinois
after its passage by law.

ORDINANCE 79-7

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 28, SECTION 27, CHAPTER 28, SECTION 27 (a) and ORDINANCE 78-3, REGARDING WATER AND SEWER RATES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois, that:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 28, Section 27, is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. Residential - \$1.00 per 100 gallons of metered water \$6.00 minimum on first 6000 gallons to be billed per calendar quarter.
2. Commercial - \$1.50 per 1000 gallons of metered water and \$9.00 minimum of first 6000 gallons or less to be billed per calendar quarter.

SECTION TWO: Chapter 28, Section 27 (a) is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. Water Only - \$1.00 per 1000 gallons of metered water and \$6.00 minimum on 6000 gallons or less to be billed per calendar quarter.
2. Sewer Only -- Resident -- \$20.00 per calendar quarter.
3. Sewer Only -- Non-Resident -- \$40.00 per calendar quarter.
4. Water and Sewer -- Non Resident -- Same as residential combined rate.

SECTION THREE: Ordinance 78-3, Chapter 28, Section 9, is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. Residential - Resident -- Sewer, \$300.00; Water, \$500.00.
2. Residential - Non-Resident -- Sewer, \$600.00; Water, \$1,000.00.
3. Multiple Units - \$450.00 per unit.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, and publication, as required by law.

ORDINANCE 79-9

BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 75-7, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of East Dundee is presently reviewing all ordinances of the Village for the purpose of a new codified code; and

WHEREAS, one of the ordinances so reviewed, is that relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, in review of said ordinance, said Village Board has deemed it in the best interest of the Village to make the amendments hereinafter noted, effective as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village of East Dundee have the right to establish such regulations and restrictions upon issuance of and operation under local licenses, not inconsistent with the said law, as the public good and convenience may require; and

WHEREAS, said Village Board deems it in the best interest of the Village of East Dundee and consistent with the public good and convenience and said Village, that the following amendments be passed:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois:

SECTION 1. EMPLOYEE PERMITS (Section 3) shall be amended to add the following language to said section:

"Employee Permits shall be issued for a specific location and the employee shall post the permit upon the premises where it can be examined. When the employee leaves his employment, the employee shall surrender the permit to the Local Liquor Control Commission."

SECTION 2. LIMITATIONS AND RE-ISSUANCE OF LICENSES (Section 5) shall be amended by revising the wording of subsection (d) as follows:

- (d) No Class A or Class B license shall be issued to any person or firm whose principal business is the retail sale to the general public of products other than alcoholic liquor. This provision shall not apply to restaurants serving food for consumption on the premises or grocery stores.

SECTION 3. TRANSFER OF LICENSE (New Section) titled Section 4A, shall be added as follows:

A license shall be purely a personal privilege good

for not to exceed one (1) year after issuance, unless sooner revoked as in this Ordinance provided, and shall not constitute property, nor shall it be subject to attachment, garnishment or execution; nor shall it be alienable or transferable, voluntarily or involuntarily, or subject to being encumbered or hypothecated. Such licensee shall not descent by the laws of testate or intestate devolution, but it shall cease upon the death of the licensee, provided that executors or administrators of estate of any deceased licensee, and the trustee of any insolvent or bankrupt licensee, when such estate consists of part of alcoholic liquor, may continue the business of the sale of alcoholic liquor under the order of the appropriate court, and may exercise the privileges of the deceased or insolvent or bankrupt licensee after the death of such decedent of such insolvency or bankruptcy, until the expiration of such license, but not longer than six (6) months after the date, insolvency or bankruptcy of such licensee. Any transfer of ownership of the business by the licensee, to include, but not limited to any transfer of any interest in individual ownership or shareholders ownership in a corporation, shall be deemed a transfer of license and said individual or corporation shall be required to reapply pursuant to normal procedure otherwise provided in this Ordinance and pay the appropriate license fee. There shall be no proration of license fee irrespective of when the application for license is received by the Local Liquor Control Commission. Any licensee may renew his license at the expiration thereof, provided he is then qualified to receive a license, and the premises for which such renewal license is sought are suitable for such purpose; and provided that he has made application for renewal; and provided further that the renewal privilege herein provided for shall not be construed as a vested right which shall in any case prevent the President and Board of Trustees from decreasing the number of licenses to be issued within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 4. CHANGE OF LOCATION (New Section) titled Section 4B shall be added as follows:

No change of location shall be permitted by the licensee. The licensee shall be required, in the event of a change in location, to reapply pursuant to appropriate procedure otherwise provided in this Ordinance and to pay the appropriate licensee fee for the new location. A license shall permit the sale of the alcoholic liquor only in the premises described in the application and license.

SECTION 5. OFFENSES BY LICENSEE (Section 6) shall be amended by revising the wording of subsection 15, as follows:

To keep open for business or to admit the public or patrons or customers of persons to any premises licensed under this ordinance for the retail sale of alcoholic liquors during the hours which sale of such liquor is prohibited or to permit or allow persons, patrons, customers, employees or licensee to remain in or about the licensed premises either before or after the hours designated within which the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors is prohibited on the licensed premises; provided, however, that the licensee and any employee, holding a valid employee permit issued under this ordinance, not to exceed a total of five (5) persons in number, shall be allowed to remain on or about the licensed premises for a period of thirty (30) minutes before and thirty (30) minutes after the hours within which the sale of liquor is permitted, provided, however that restaurants, clubs, grocery stores, drug stores, hotel and motels may keep their places of business open subject only to the provisions that neither the sale at retail, nor consumption by patrons, customers or by the public of alcoholic liquors shall be allowed on said licensed premises during the hours prohibited;

That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 79-11

SNOW REMOVAL --- INTERFERENCE BY PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

ARTICLE I

SECTION ONE: No Parking - Snow Removal. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village of East Dundee at any time within twelve (12) hours after a snowfall of three (3) inches or more has occurred.

SECTION TWO: No Parking-- Street Cleaning. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street or portion thereof in the Village of East Dundee at any time when such street is being cleaned. Signs indicating that a street or portion thereof is being cleaned shall be posted immediately before the cleaning of the street, and shall be removed after the cleaning of the street is finished.

SECTION THREE: Public Nuisance. Any vehicles parked in violation of this ordinance are hereby declared a public nuisance and a hazard to public safety, and police officers in the Village of East Dundee are hereby authorized to cause removal of said vehicle to a public garage or other place of safety during snow removal operations of the Village of East Dundee on such streets, and the expense of such removal and storage in such public garage shall be paid by the owner or operator of said vehicle.

SECTION FOUR: Any person violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each and every separate offense.

ARTICLE II

SECTION ONE: That all ordinances, resolutions and orders or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict repealed.

ARTICLE III

SECTION ONE: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as provided by law, and proper publication.

ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ALTERED SPEED ZONE

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois:

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED by the Board of the Village of East Dundee, Kane County, Illinois, that the basic statutory vehicular speed limits established by Section 11-601 of the Illinois Vehicle Code are greater, or less, than that considered reasonable and proper on the street or highway listed in the following Schedule for which the Village has maintenance responsibility and which is not under the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation, State of Illinois.

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that this Board has caused to be made and engineering and traffic investigation upon the streets or highways listed in the Schedule; and

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that, by virtue of Section 11-604 of the above Code and subject to approval by the Department, this Board determines and declares that reasonable and proper absolute maximum speed limits upon those streets and highways described in the Schedule shall be as stated therein; and

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that, by virtue of Section 11-604 of the above Code, the Department is hereby requested to review the supporting data and findings of the engineering and traffic investigation submitted and filed in duplicate for each proposed speed zone of said street or highway described in the Schedule, which is included as a part of this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that when this Board is advised that the Department has approved the proposed maximum speed limits for the zone or zones of said street or highway described in the Schedule, signs giving notice thereof shall be erected in conformance with the standards and specifications contained in the Illinois Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways; and

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that this ordinance shall take effect immediately after the erection of said signs giving notice of the maximum speed limits.
