Chapter 27A (License Fees) Section 6. Of the "Municipal Code of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6:

Every applicant, before being granted a license shall pay the following annual license fee for the privilege of operating or maintaining for operation each vending machine Juke box or mechanical amusement device as defined in Section 11 herein.

Amusement Devices	15.00

Each license shall expire at end of calendar year, December 31.

In no event shall the above-mentioned license fees exceed an amount equal to the annual liquor license fee pursuant to Chapter 3, Section 4 of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois Ordinances, if all such vending machines, juke boxes and amusement devices are being operated at one location.

MUNICIPAL SERVICE OCCUPATION TAX

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of East Dundee that:

SECTION 1: A tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in this municipality in the business of making sales of service at the rate of three-quarters of one per cent of the cost price of all tangible personal property transferred by said servicemen either in the form of tangible personal property or in the form of real estate as an incident to a sale of service, in accordance with the provisions of Section 8-11-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

SECTION 2: Every supplier or serviceman required to account for Municipal Service Occupation Tax for the benefit of this municipality shall file, on or before the last day of each calendar month, the report to the State Department of Revenue required by Section Nine of the Service Occupation Tax Act.

SECTION 3: At the time such report is filed, there shall be paid to the State Department of revenue the amount of tax hereby imposed.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk is hereby directed to transmit to the State Department of Revenue a certified copy of this ordinance not later than five (5) days after the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be published within ten (10) days of its enactment as provided in Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code and shall be effective from and after the first day of the calendar month next following the expiration of the ten (10) day publication period.

SECTION 6: Chapter 23 A Sec.1-5 inclusive entitled Municipal Service Occupation Tax passed August 21, 1967 is hereby repealed effective April 30, 1968.

THIS ORDINANCE shall take effect on the first day of May, 1968.

AMENDMENT

Chapter 7 (Buildings) of the "Municipal Code of the Village of East Dundee, Illinois" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follos:

Article 1.

Sec.9 Delete Paragraphs A and B of present Section 9. Insert "The fees to be charged for building permits shall be as follows:

(a) For each permit to erect a single family dwelling or duplex the sum of \$4.00 per 100 square feet or fractional part thereof, plus \$15.00 to cover the cost of the minimum of three inspections at \$5.00 each. For each permit to erect an apartment, motel, hotel or like larger structures the sum of \$3.00 per 100 square feet or fractional part thereof, plus the cost of \$15.00 to cover the cost of the minimum of three inspections at \$5.00 each.

Additional inspections may be required, at the discretion of the building inspector, at a cost of \$5.00 for each inspection with a mximum of one inspection for 400 square feet, If when called for inspection the inspector finds conditions which must be corrected, and therefore require extra inspections to determine if the corrections have been made, a fee of \$5.00 for each additional inspection shall be charged. These additional inspections shall not be subject to the limitations of the maximum of one inspection per 400 square feet.

(b) For each permit to repair, alter or enlarge any building or part thereof, for which a permit is required, the sum of \$4.00 per 100 square feet or fractional part thereof for single family swellings or duplexes; sum of \$3.00 per 100 square feet or fractional part thereof for apartment, motel, hotel or like larger structures, provided that there should be a minimum fee of \$5.00 for such permit. Inspections may be required at the discretion of the building inspector at \$5.00 per inspection with a maximum of one inspection per 400 square feet or fractional part thereof. If when called for inspection the inspector finds conditions which must be corrected, and therefore require extra inspections to determine if the corrections have been made, a fee of \$5.00 each additional inspection shall be charged. These additional inspections shall not be subject to the limitations of the maximum of one inspection per 400 square feet of cost. Minor repairs, alterations or enlargements which do not involve any change in the structural part of the building or of the stairways, elevators, fire escapes or other means of communication or egress or ingress, and which cost less than \$250.00 may be made without a permit, however, such repairs, alterations or enlargements must be done under the supervision of the President and Board of Trustees.

ORDINANCE NO. 68-8

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS, TO PROCLAIM THE EXISTENCE OF CIVIL EMERGENCY, IMPOSE CURFEWS, AND REGULATE THE CONDUCT OF CERTAIN BUSINESSES DURING CIVIL EMERGENCIES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS.

SECTION 1: Definitions:

(a) A civil emergency is hereby defined to be:

(1) A riot or unlawful assembly characterized by the use of actual force or violence or any threat to use force if accompanied by immediate power to execute by three or more persons acting together without authority of law;

or

(2) Any natural disaster or manmade calamity, including flood, conflagration, cyclone, tornado, earthquake or explosion within the corporate limits of the Village of East Dundee, resulting in the death or injury of persons or the destruction of property to such extent that extraordinary measures must be taken to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

(b) Curfew is hereby defined as a prohibition against any person or persons walking, running, loitering, standing or motoring upon any alley, street, highway, public property or vacant premises within the corporate limits of the Village of East Dundee, excepting officials of any governmental unit and persons officially designated to duty with reference to said civil emergency.

SECTION 2: Whenever an emergency as defined in Section 1 of this Ordinance exists, the mayor shall declare the existence by means of a written declaration setting forth the facts which constitute the emergency.

SECTION 3: After proclamation of a civil emergency by the mayor, he may order a general curfew applicable to such geographical areas of the Village or to the Village as a whole, as he deems advisable, and applicable during such hours of the day or night as he deems necessary in the interests of the public safety and welfare.

SECTION 4: After the proclamation of a civil emergency, the mayor of the Village of East Dundee may also in the interest of public safety and welfare make any or all of the following orders:

(a) Order the closing of all retail liquor stores, including taverns and private clubs or portions thereof wherein the consumption of intoxicating liquor and beer is permitted.

(b) Order the discontinuance of the sale of alcoholic liquor by any wholesaler or retailer.

(c) Order the discontinuance of selling, distributing or giving away gasoline or other liquid flammable or combustible products in any container other than a gasoline tank properly affixed to a motor vehicle.

ORDINANCE NO. 68-9

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND PROHIBITING VAGRANCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES of the Village of EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS, as follows:

No person in the Village shall have the status or condition of a "vagrant".

The following persons shall be deemed vagrants:

(a) No Lawful Means of Support. Any person having no lawful means of employment and having no lawful means of support realized solely from lawful occupations or other sources; or, any person who lives idly and without visible means of support.

(b) Loitering. Any person found loitering or strolling in, about, or upon any street, alley, or other public way or public place, or at any public gathering or assembly, or in or around any store, shop, or business or commercial establishment, or on any private property or place without lawful business and conducting himself in a lewd, wanton or lascivious manner in speech or behavior.

(c) Burglars' Tools. Any person upon whose person or in whose possession shall be found any instrument, tool, or other implement for picking locks or pockets, or any implement that is usually employed or that reasonably may be inferred to have been designed to be employed in the commission of any felony, misdemeanor or the violation of any ordinance, and who shall fail to account satisfactorily for the possession of the same.

(d) Unlawful Occupancy. Any person wandering abroad and occupying lodging, or sleeping in any vacant or unoccupied, barn, garage, shed, shop, or other building or structure, or in any automobile, truck, railroad car, or other vehicle without owning the same or without permission of the owner or person entitled to the possession of the same, or sleeping in any vacant lot during the hours of darkness and not giving a satisfactory account of himself.

(e) Begging. Any person wandering abroad and begging; or any person who goes about from door to door of private homes or commercial and business establishments, or places himself in or upon any public way or public place to beg or receive alms for himself.

(f) Abroad at Unusual Hours. Any person who wanders about the streets, alleys, or other public ways or places, or who is found abroad at late or unusual hours in the night without any visible or lawful business and not giving a satisfactory account of himself.

(g) Illegal Association. Any person who keeps, operates, frequents, lives in, or is employed in any house or other establishment of ill fame, or who (whether married or single) engages in or commits acts of fornication or perversion for hire.

(h) Illegal Employment. Any person who frequents or loafs, loiters, or idles in or around or is the occupant of or is employed in any gambling establishment or establishment where intoxicating liquor is sold without a license.

(i) Fraudulent Schemes. Any person who shall engage in any fraudulent scheme, device, or trick to obtain money or other valuable thing from others; or any person who aids or assists such trick, device or scheme.

(j) Concealing Stolen Property. Any person who keeps a place where lost or stolen property is concealed.

AN ORDINANCE

ANNEXING A CERTAIN PART OF THE NORTH EAST QUARTER OF SECTION 25, TOWNSHIP 42 NORTH, RANGE 8 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, TO THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, a Petition signed by the owner of record of the land hereinafter described has been filed with the Village Clerk, and no electors reside thereon; and,

WHEREAS, said Petition requests the annexation of such territories to the Village of East Dundee and contains statements therein under oath that all of the owners of record of such lands have joined in said Petition and that no electors reside thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That the territories and lands described as follows, to-wit:

That part of the North East quarter of Section 25, Township 42 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows: Beginning at the North East corner of said Section; thence South on the Section line 28 chains; thence North 80½ degrees West, 15.09 chains more or less, to the South East corner of premises conveyed to James K. Smith by deed dated February 3, 1881, and recorded February 7, 1881, in Book 200, page 253, as Document 13594; thence North along said Smiths' East line to the North line of said Section 25; thence East along the Section line 14.93 chains more or less, to the point of beginning, in Kane County, Illinois,

being contiguous to the Village of East Dundee and not a part of any municipality, be and they are hereby annexed to and made a part of the Village of East Dundee.

Section 2. That the boundary lines of the Village of East Dundee be and they are hereby enlarged and extended to include within the corporate boundaries thereof the above-described territories.

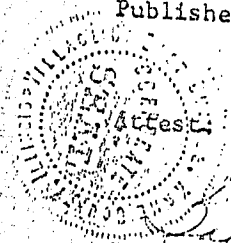
Section 3. That said territories be and they are hereby included as their present County classification as set forth in the Zoning Ordinance of Kane County, Illinois.
