**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3, CHAPTER 2,
ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR REGULATIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF
THE VILLAGE OF WEST DUNDEE, ILLINOIS OF 2004, AS AMENDED,
AMENDING LICENSE CLASSIFICATIONS AND NUMBER OF LICENSES**

WHEREAS, the Village of West Dundee, Kane County, Illinois is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 235 ILCS Article IV under the Illinois Liquor Control Act which has expressly conferred certain powers on municipalities with regard to the issuance of retail liquor licenses; and

WHEREAS, the amendment of various provisions of the Alcoholic Liquor Regulations, as related to license classifications and numbers of licenses, are needed to clarify and provide consistency with the current business environment; and

WHEREAS, a liquor license request has been received by the Village on behalf of Open Bar Catering LLC, requesting liquor sales in conjunction catered events, and the Village of West Dundee has reviewed the request and is supportive of the addition of a new license classification, Class M, to facilitate the described business use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES, VILLAGE OF WEST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS that:

Section 1: The Municipal Code of the Village of West Dundee, Title 3 Chapter 2, Alcoholic Liquor Regulations, Section 3-2-8 License Classifications, as amended, shall be, and the same hereby is amended by repealing in its entirety the said Section 3-2-8 and enacting a new Section 3-2-8 in lieu thereof, as attached.

Section 2: The Municipal Code of the Village of West Dundee, Title 3 Chapter 2, Alcoholic Liquor Regulations, Section 3-2-9 Number of Licenses, as amended, shall be, and the same hereby is amended by repealing in its entirety the said Section 3-2-9 and enacting a new Section 3-2-9 in lieu thereof, as attached.


Section 3: That all ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict repealed.


Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force as provided by law and after publication in pamphlet form pursuant to the authority of the Board of Trustees.

3-2-8: LICENSE CLASSIFICATIONS:

All establishments granted class AAA, AA, A, B, D, or F alcoholic liquor licenses as set forth herein shall be permitted extended hours and remain open until two o'clock (2:00) A.M. on January 1, New Year's Day, of each year licensed thereunder.

~~All establishments granted class C, CC, or CCC alcoholic liquor licenses as set forth herein and located within the confines of the department anchors and/or the property commonly known as Spring Hill Mall shall be permitted extended hours to begin alcoholic sales on Sunday beginning at nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. but ending at eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. between the Thanksgiving and New Year's holidays.~~

Every person, firm or corporation engaged in the retail sale of alcoholic liquor in the village of West Dundee, Illinois, shall pay an annual license fee by cashier's or certified check according to the following classification of alcoholic liquor licenses.

~~A. Class AAA License:~~

- ~~1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises, served with meals in restaurants, taverns, hotels, motels, inns or eating establishments, at retail, and providing specifically for a Sunday brunch privilege to be served at tables, from and after nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. in the morning.~~
- ~~2. Closing Hours: Class AAA licensed premises shall not be open to the public Monday through Saturday between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sunday between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.~~
- ~~3. Revocation Of License: In the event that the licensed premises at any time prior to the issuance of a Class AAA license was licensed under any other classification of license contained in this chapter, the Local Liquor Control Commissioner may, at his discretion, and at any time within ninety (90) days subsequent to the issuance of such Class AAA license, rescind or cancel such license. In that event, the classification of the licensee shall revert to that class which was in effect prior to the granting of the Class AAA license.~~

A. Class AAA License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises, in taverns, at retail, and having one or more service bars.
2. Closing Hours: Class AAA licensed premises shall not be open to the public on Mondays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., Tuesdays through Fridays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., Saturdays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., and on Sundays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

B. Class AA License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises, ~~served with meals~~ in an entertainment venue ~~or eating establishment~~, at retail, and having one or more service bars.
2. Closing Hours: Class AA licensed premises shall not be open to the public Tuesdays through Sundays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. and on Mondays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M.

3. Three O'Clock Closing Hours: The closing hours under such Class AA license shall permit the establishment to be open until three o'clock (3:00) A.M. no more than six (6) nights per license year. The licensee shall have the obligation of notifying, in writing, the Local Liquor Control Commission and the Village Board thirty (30) days prior to the use of any of the six (6) permitted three o'clock (3:00) A.M. license privileges.

C. Class A License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises, ~~whether~~ served with full service meals in restaurants, taverns, hotels, motels, inns or eating establishments, at retail, and having one or more service bars.
2. Closing Hours: Class A licensed premises shall not be open to the public on Mondays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., Tuesdays through Fridays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., Saturdays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., and on Sundays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

D. Class B License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing beer and wine only for consumption on the premises, ~~whether~~ served with meals in restaurants, taverns, hotels, motels, inns or eating establishments, at retail, having one or more service bars.
2. Closing Hours: Class B licensed premises shall not be open to the public Mondays through Saturdays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sundays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

E. Class C License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises and in package form only.
2. Closing Hours: Class C licensed premises shall not be open to the public Mondays through Saturdays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sundays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M.
3. Age Requirement:
 - a. Employee Age: All employees selling, delivering, checking out or receiving payment for packaged alcoholic liquors in establishments holding Class C or Class CCC licenses shall be at least twenty one (21) years of age.
 - b. Grocery Store Age Requirement Exception: An employee "scanning" the packaged alcoholic liquor is the only employee required to be twenty one (21) years of age and is responsible for verifying the customer is twenty one (21) years of age.
4. More Than One Business: The requirements as set forth in this subsection E4 shall apply to Class C licenses where more than one business is maintained on the same premises.
 - a. Liquor Separate: All liquor must be physically separate from the other types of business on the premises.
 - b. Beer And Wine Displays:
 - (1) Beer and wine displays are prohibited adjacent to cash registers or the front doors of the premises.

(2) Beer and wine displays shall be prohibited in any pharmacy section and toy and/or children's aisle of the premises.

F. Class CC License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises and in package form only, and dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises, ~~whether~~ served with meals in restaurants, hotel/motels, eating establishments, or retail establishments, having one service bar only.
2. Closing Hours: Class CC licensed premises shall not be open to the public Monday through Saturday between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sunday between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M.
3. Special Events:
 - a. Number Of Events: This license classification permits the use of the allowance of alcoholic liquor privileges in conjunction with Village approved special events not to exceed more than eighteen (18) events within any one liquor license year. One event consists of one day.
 - b. Special Event Application Form: For each event, either located within the establishment's business address or outside the business address must be filed at least twenty one (21) business days prior to the date of the event. The Village Manager is authorized to approve such events subject to the completed application and notification to the Local Liquor Control Commission.
 - c. Supervision; Designated Area: The event shall be attended and supervised by a full time employee and take place only in a designated area on the licensed premises as approved by the Village Manager and designated in the permit.

G. Class CCC License:

1. Regulations: For establishments dispensing beer and wine only for consumption off the premises and in package form only.
2. Conditions: This license may be issued to retail food stores, department stores, and retail food stores also selling gasoline upon the following conditions, and provided that all the following said conditions are met at all times during the term of said license:
 - a. Only beer and wine, as defined in the Illinois Liquor Control Act, may be sold.
 - b. The minimum inventory level for all store products shall be thirty five thousand dollars (\$35,000.00) in retail value.
 - c. Beer and wine sales shall not exceed twenty five percent (25%) of all retail sales in such establishment, during any consecutive twelve (12) month period.
 - d. No displays of beer and wine shall be located within five feet (5') of the store's entrance.
 - e. All beer shall only be sold from, or displayed in, electrical refrigeration coolers, or other cabinets or displays which can be secured.
 - f. Employees selling, delivering, checking out or receiving payment for packaged alcoholic liquors must be twenty one (21) years of age or older.
 - g. No video or other electronic games shall be allowed on the premises of such establishment.

h. In addition, retail food stores selling gasoline shall meet the following conditions:

(1) No temporary point of sale, beer or wine advertising shall be located on gasoline islands and no lighted or unlighted permanent signage advertising beer or wine shall be located on buildings, in windows, or within five feet (5') of any window. If a freestanding sign is permitted on the licensed premises pursuant to a Village ordinance, only generic advertising using the words "beer" or "wine", and descriptive terms relating thereto (exclusive of brand and price advertising) shall be permitted.

(2) All beer and wine shall be sold in the original manufacturer's packaging.

3. Closing Hours: Class CCC licensed premises shall not sell alcoholic beverages Mondays through Saturdays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sundays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

H. Class D License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments identified as a club, organized not for profit, dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises.
2. Closing Hours: Class D licensed premises shall not be open to the public Mondays through Saturdays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and on Sundays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

I. Class E License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on premises in an outdoor area in conjunction with food service, and Class ~~AAA, AA,~~ A, B, D or F alcoholic liquor licenses.
2. Closing Hours: Class E licensed premises shall not be open to the public Mondays through Sundays between the hours of ten thirty o'clock (10:30) P.M. and ten thirty o'clock (10:30) A.M.
2-a. Class E licensed premises located within the confines of the property commonly known as Spring Hill Mall shall be permitted extended hours to for alcoholic sales on Friday and Saturday nights, and therefore shall not be open to the public Mondays through Fridays between the hours of ten thirty o'clock (10:30) P.M. and ten thirty o'clock (10:30) A.M. and Saturdays through Sundays between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) A.M. and thirty o'clock (10:30) A.M. Expanded outdoor dining area hours shall correspond with continuation of meal service until at least eleven-thirty o'clock (11:30) P.M. on Fridays and Saturdays.
3. Screening: The outdoor area shall be screened and enclosed by either landscaping or fencing.
4. Entertainment Or Sound Amplification: Entertainment or sound amplification in outdoor areas subject to the Class E license shall be limited so as not to be heard more than seventy five feet (75') from the outdoor dining area.
5. Special Use: A special use subject to the provisions of title 10, chapter 5, "Business Districts", of this Code shall be required for the issuance of a Class E license.

J. Class F License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for establishments dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises and engaged in the actual brewing and production of beer on the premises and for the dispensing of beer that has been brewed and produced on site for consumption off the premises and in packaged form only. This license shall be issued only to establishments with a microbrewery having meal service, and a restaurant capacity of not less than one hundred (100) seats.
2. Closing Hours: Class F licensed premises shall not be open to the public Mondays through Thursdays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., on Fridays and Saturdays between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M., and on Sundays between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M.

K. Class G License:

1. Regulations: A class G license authorizes the retail sale of alcoholic beverages on the premises owned (or controlled) and operated by a park district organized under the provisions of the park district code, 70 Illinois Compiled Statutes 1205/1-1 et seq., for consumption on the premises. Each class G license shall describe the premises approved (1 license per location) for retail sale, which may include more than one structure at a given location and may provide for the outside sale of alcoholic beverages. Any class G license issued shall be limited to uses in existence at the effective date hereof.
2. Closing Hours: Class G licensed premises shall not be open to the public daily between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M.

L. Class H License:

1. Regulations: A class H license shall be required for a restaurant, whether or not it holds a current liquor license, to permit patrons to bring, possess and consume wine, beer or malt beverage on the premises. No other alcoholic liquor shall be permitted under a class H corkage license. It shall be unlawful for any commercial establishment, except for those herein defined as a "restaurant", to permit patrons to bring, possess and consume wine, beer or malt beverage on the premises. The following regulations further apply to any class H license holder:
 - a. No more than seven hundred fifty milliliters (750 ml) of wine or three (3) twelve ounce (12 oz) beer or malt beverages per patron over the age of twenty one (21) shall be permitted to be uncorked.
 - b. Only patrons seated at tables or booths shall be permitted to consume wine, beer or malt beverage that has been provided by the patron.
 - c. Wine, beer or malt beverage may be consumed only by individuals who order and are served a meal by the licensee.
 - d. Every container of wine, beer or malt beverage brought onto the premises by a patron must be opened by the restaurant personnel, and it shall be unlawful for any patron to leave the premises with a partially consumed container of wine, beer or malt beverage unless it is securely sealed by restaurant personnel prior to removal from the premises and placed in a transparent onetime use tamperproof bag, as required by state law.
 - e. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.
2. Closing Hours: Class H licensed premises shall not be permitted to present alcohol for consumption except between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. If a class H licensed establishment possesses an additional liquor license classification, those permitted hours of operations shall prevail.

M. Class J License:

1. Regulations: A class J license shall be required for a merchant, whether or not it holds a current liquor license, to permit for the sale of beer and wine only in package form for consumption off premises, specifically in conjunction with an authorized special or public event approved by the village of West Dundee. No other alcoholic liquor privileges shall be permitted under a class J license. The following regulations further apply to any class J license holder:
 - a. All employees selling, delivering, checking out or receiving payment for packaged liquors shall be at least twenty one (21) years of age and shall be BASSET certified.
 - b. Samples and tastings shall be allowed pursuant to the Illinois liquor code requirements.
 - c. Purchase or possession of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.
 - d. A one hundred dollar (\$100.00) initial application fee is required of any vendor who is not a current West Dundee liquor license holder, in addition to the annual license fee.
2. Closing Hours: Class J licensed premises shall not be permitted to sell beer and wine for consumption off premises except between the hours of eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) P.M.

N. Class K License:

1. Regulations: Licenses for motion picture theaters dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises and offering food items from a fixed concession counter during all hours in which alcoholic liquors are offered for sale. The following regulations further apply to any class K license holder:
 - a. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.
 - b. Patrons purchasing or possessing alcoholic liquor must be fitted with an identifiable wristband after evidencing they are the age of twenty one (21) or older.
 - c. The containers in which alcoholic liquors are served must be of a different color, size and design than those in which nonalcoholic beverages are served.
 - d. No more than two (2) alcoholic liquor drinks may be sold to any patron during any one transaction.
 - e. Alcoholic liquors may only be consumed within the theater premises as delineated and identified on an approved floor plan and signage will be posted providing notice that patrons may not exit the theater premises with any alcoholic liquors.
 - f. All employees engaged in the sale and service of alcoholic liquors shall be BASSET certified.
 - g. There shall be no service of alcoholic beverages unless the theater is actually open for the showing of movies. Class K licensed premises are not permitted to sell or serve alcoholic beverages any earlier than one hour prior to the first advertised showing time of the first movie to be shown on any day.
2. Closing Hours: Class K licensed premises shall not be permitted to sell or present alcohol for consumption between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. on any given day.

O. Class L License:

1. Regulations: License authorizes the sale of beer and wine at arts, crafts and entertainment studios. Such sales and consumption shall be limited to registered patrons assembled on the premises for the purpose of attending an art, craft, or other class offered by an art studio, arts and crafts school, or similar leisure/entertainment business while the licensee is conducting classes. The following regulations further apply to any class L license holder:

a. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.

b. All employees engaged in the sale and service of alcoholic liquors shall be BASSET certified.

c. The service of beer and wine shall only be allowed during the time at which the facility is conducting a class.

—Closing Hours: Class L licensed premises shall not be permitted to present alcohol for consumption between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M.

P. Class M License:

1. Regulations: A class M license allows the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption off the premises by a licensee who holds no other liquor license issued pursuant to this chapter; provided, that such sales are provided by a caterer and are limited to invited guests at catered functions. A class M license shall only be issued to a caterer who conducts business from a location established within the boundaries of the Village and shall only be valid for catered functions located within the boundaries of the Village. For purposes of a class M license, a "caterer" or terms of similar import shall mean and refer to a business or activity, the purpose of which is the processing, preparing and serving of food and/or drink items for immediate consumption off the premises. At all times, the class M license holder shall comply with all of the provisions of this chapter governing licenses and license holders, including, but not limited to, BASSET regulations (beverage alcohol sellers and servers education and training program). The following regulations further apply to any class M license holder:

a. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.

b. All employees engaged in the sale and service of alcoholic liquors shall be BASSET certified.

2. Closing Hours: Class M licensed operations shall not be permitted to present alcohol for consumption between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) AM and ten o'clock (10:00) AM, Saturday & Sunday; and; between midnight (12:00) AM and ten o'clock (10:00) AM, Monday through Friday.

N-Q. Daily Permit: The local liquor control commission may grant a daily permit to any not for profit organization or club, business, or local liquor license holder held in good standing by the village and located in or providing service in the village. A daily permit shall be valid for one day only and the commission reserves the right to limit the sale of liquor to particular times during the day of the permit. Permits shall be issued in accordance with the following standards:

1. No more than six (6) such daily permits shall be issued to any one such organization, club, business or liquor licensee during the period of one year. A daily permit shall not be issued for any more than four (4) consecutive days.
2. No more than eighteen (18) total daily permits will be issued by the village during any one 12-month period (May 1 through April 30).
3. The daily permit fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day shall be payable by the permittee upon the issuance of a daily permit. This permit fee shall not be waived for any organization or business.
4. At a minimum, the following information is to be submitted regarding the event:
 - a. Date, times and location of the event.
 - b. Type of alcohol to be served.
 - c. Description of security measures to be utilized for both liquor service and the event.
 - d. Description of the area in which alcoholic liquor will be available for service and for consumption.
5. Unless specifically provided otherwise all requirements of this chapter shall apply to permits granted under this section.
6. The local liquor control commission will make a recommendation to the village board upon the issuance of a daily permit request. The final action and approval or disapproval will be taken by the village board.
7. Application for a daily permit must be submitted sixty (60) days in advance of the event.

O-R. Special Use Permit License: A special use permit license allows a licensed Illinois retailer to transfer a portion of its alcoholic liquor inventory from the retail licensed premises to the premises specified in the special use permit license, and to sell or offer for sale at retail, only on the premises specified in the special use permit license, the transferred alcoholic liquor for use or consumption on the specified premises. A special use permit license shall be granted for the following time periods: One day to a maximum of fifteen (15) days per special use location in any fiscal year (May 1 to the following April 30) period. An applicant for a special use permit license shall submit with the application satisfactory proof of dramshop liability insurance to the maximum statutory limits. Prior to the licensed event on the specified premises, the Illinois retailer shall submit a copy of the state issued special use permit license to the village.

1. The special use permit license fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per event shall be payable by the permittee upon the issuance of any special use permit license. This permit fee shall not be waived for any organization.
2. At a minimum, the following information is to be submitted regarding the event:
 - a. Date, times and location of the event.
 - b. Type of alcohol to be served.
 - c. Description of the area in which alcoholic liquor will be available for service and consumption.

3. The local liquor control commission will approve any initial special use permit license for any liquor license holder or establishment. Any future requests for special use permit license made by the same establishment may be approved directly by the village manager's office.

~~P.A. Class K License:~~

- ~~1. Regulations: Licenses for motion picture theaters dispensing alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises and offering food items from a fixed concession counter during all hours in which alcoholic liquors are offered for sale. The following regulations further apply to any class K license holder:
 - ~~a. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.~~
 - ~~b.a. Patrons purchasing or possessing alcoholic liquor must be fitted with an identifiable wristband after evidencing they are the age of twenty one (21) or older.~~
 - ~~c.a. The containers in which alcoholic liquors are served must be of a different color, size and design than those in which nonalcoholic beverages are served.~~
 - ~~d.a. No more than two (2) alcoholic liquor drinks may be sold to any patron during any one transaction.~~

- ~~2.1. Closing Hours: Class K licensed premises shall not be permitted to sell or present alcohol for consumption between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. on any given day.~~

~~Q.A. Class L License:~~

- ~~1. Regulations: License authorizes the sale of beer and wine at arts, crafts and entertainment studios. Such sales and consumption shall be limited to registered patrons assembled on the premises for the purpose of attending an art, craft, or other class offered by an art studio, arts and crafts school, or similar leisure/entertainment business while the licensee is conducting classes. The following regulations further apply to any class L license holder:
 - ~~a. Possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under the age of twenty one (21) is prohibited.~~
 - ~~b.a. All employees engaged in the sale and service of alcoholic liquors shall be BASSET certified.~~
 - ~~c.a. The service of beer and wine shall only be allowed during the time at which the facility is conducting a class.~~~~
- ~~2.1. Closing Hours: Class L licensed premises shall not be permitted to present alcohol for consumption between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M.~~

3-2-9: LICENSE FEES AND NUMBER:

The following alcoholic liquor license fees shall be paid to the Village Clerk or Deputy Village Clerk at the time the application is filed, and shall forthwith be deposited with the Village Manager until the application has been reviewed by the Local Liquor Control Commission. In the event the license applied for is denied, then the fee shall be returned to the applicant; if the license is granted, then the fee shall be deposited in the General Fund or in such other fund as shall have been designated by the Board of Trustees by proper action.
