

ORDINANCE 2015-03

An Ordinance Revising Title 7 Motor Vehicles and Traffic Chapter 1-14

WHEREAS, the Village of West Dundee, Kane County, Illinois, is a home rule municipality as contemplated under article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois;

WHEREAS, the Village of West Dundee Police Department has conducted a traffic study of the intersection of Grand Pointe Blvd. and Walnut Dr. (Karen Dr.) and determined that due to poor visibility and a high pedestrian volume, that a four-way stop is warranted over the intersection, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-1-14 Traffic Control Devices, the Village of West Dundee President and Board of Trustees are authorized to regulate, warn or guide traffic pursuant to traffic warrants or criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES, VILLAGE OF WEST DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT, pursuant to Section 7-1-14 of the West Dundee Municipal Code, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of West Dundee authorize the installation of the following traffic control signage.


Section 1: That the intersection of Grand Pointe Blvd. and Walnut Dr. (Karen Dr.) is hereby designated as an ALL-WAY STOP intersection.

Section 2: That all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict herewith be, and the same are, repealed and are of no further force and effect.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage as provided by law.


